

CITIZENS' INJUNCTION
*To halt the shipment of military material
through the publicly funded Port of Grays Harbor
for so long as the occupation of Iraq continues*

WHEREAS the United Nations Charter, the Nuremberg Tribunal Charter and the Geneva Conventions are United States law by merit of the facts that:

- 1) These treaties were ratified by the U.S. Congress
- 2) International treaties ratified by the U.S. Congress become the supreme "Law of the Land" as per Article VI of the U.S. Constitution

WHEREAS aggressive attacks of sovereign nations by other sovereign nations are prohibited not only by these U.S. laws, but also by the U.S. War Crimes Act

WHEREAS the "Shock and Awe" military campaign of mid-March 2003 visited upon the sovereign nation of Iraq by the United States of America irrefutably qualifies as an aggressive and belligerent attack

WHEREAS the subsequent occupation of Iraq irrefutably qualifies as an aggressive and belligerent act

WHEREAS this invasion and occupation are not only illegal but are also immoral by merit of the fact that IT IS WRONG to kill or harm our fellow human beings

WHEREAS the magnitude of the suffering that this war has wrought is tragic and staggering and will continue for generations to come

WHEREAS the approximate 411 billion dollars so far used to execute this war should have gone for the public good, for such things as education, healthcare, roads, libraries, housing, the development of alternative energy, the restoration of the environment and jobs

WHEREAS the United States must announce an immediate ceasefire and quick withdrawal, the withdrawal to be accomplished within a maximum of 3 months

WHEREAS our elected officials are not moving to bring about a quick ceasefire and withdrawal

WHEREAS there is no better way to support the troops than to work for an end to this war and for their quick return home

WHEREAS the shipment of military material and personnel to Iraq allows the war to continue

WHEREAS the movement should be OUT OF IRAQ and not INTO IRAQ

WHEREAS we wish to use every non-violent method available to us to end this war

WHEREAS prohibiting the shipping of military materials from the Port of Grays Harbor is one such method

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we the undersigned citizens of the United States of America, in an effort to end this war and bring our troops home, do hereby prohibit the shipment of military supplies from the publicly funded Port of Grays Harbor for so long as the occupation of Iraq continues.
